London Concert Choir is one of London's leading amateur choirs. A lively and friendly choir with around 150 members, its wide repertoire ranges from unaccompanied church music and largescale choral works to jazz standards and concert performances of operas and musicals. With Music Director Mark Forkgen the choir regularly appears at all the major London concert venues and also tours to European destinations. LCC has performed Haydn's oratorio The Seasons in the Basilica at Assisi and most recently visited Krakow.

The choir celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2010 with two performances of Britten's War Requiem. Other major works have included Mozart's Requiem with the London Mozart Players, Rachmaninov's choral symphony The Bells with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and Vaughan Williams' Sea Symphony with Southbank Sinfonia, as the main work in a Battle of Jutland centenary concert in 2016.

Performances of Baroque music with Counterpoint include Handel's Messiah, Bach's St Matthew Passion and Monteverdi's Vespers of 1610. Operas in concert performance have ranged from Gluck's Orfeo to Gershwin's Porgy and Bess, and the London premiere of The Chalk Legend by Stephen McNeff. The choir often gives concerts for charity and continues to commission new works.

**Mark Forkgen** recently celebrated 20 years as the choir's Music Director. He is also Music Director of Canticum chamber choir, Principal Conductor and Artistic Advisor of Kokoro (the new music group of the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra) and Director of Music at Tonbridge School. A specialist in contemporary music, Mark also enjoys an active career as a pianist and as guest conductor with leading British orchestras.



This is a rare chance to hear Schubert's magnificent final Mass, written in 1828, just before his tragically early death. The setting is mainly choral, while the orchestral colour is dominated by woodwinds, brass and timpani. Combining Schubert's own gift for melody with the drama of Beethoven, the Mass also includes some astonishing harmonies.

The symphony was begun six years earlier. Although it was unfinished, its two movements are complete in themselves, as the sublime second movement resolves the tensions of the first. Mendelssohn's graceful prayer for peace was strongly influenced by Bach.

Alison Willis was commissioned by choir member Adrienne Morgan to write a piece celebrating life and humankind and the potential for all to make the world a better place. Subtitled *Affirmation*, the work emphasises the sustaining power of a positive outlook on living with breast cancer.

The Five Mystical Songs for baritone soloist and chorus by Vaughan Williams are settings of poems by the visionary 17th-century poet George Herbert. The composer conducted the first performance at the Three Choirs Festival in 1911. Ten years later, the rich harmonies of his Mass for unaccompanied double choir and soloists revived the choral tradition of the English Renaissance composers, particularly Byrd and Tallis whose music had just been rediscovered.

After the concert there will be a collection in aid of Breast Cancer Now.
